

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation has a history of honoring and observing the annual National Day of Prayer in the United States. Several Principal Chiefs, dating back to the Perry Beaver administration, have issued proclamations recognizing the date. Principal Chief David Hill proclaimed April 2, 2022 as the tribe's recognition of this year's National Day of Prayer.

Numerous ministers and Mvskoke church leaders met in Glenpool, at the Conference Center, to participate in an observance. A program was coordinated by Reverend Al Pulver, and his wife Betty, from Sapulpa's Covenant Harvest Ministries Prayer Group.

MC National Council Representative Mark Randolph, Wagoner District, read the proclamation on behalf of Principal Chief Hill, and led a prayer for Unity, Sovereignty, and a return to basic values, morals and beliefs of the Mvskoke people.

## Supporting Founders

Reverend Jimmy "Bunny" Hill April 2, 1950- June 17, 1999

Reverend Jimmy "Bunny" Hill, a lifetong member and Pastor of Yardeka Indian Baptist Church, also served as one of the founding supporters of the Muskogee Nation National Day of Prayer & Fasting. As a man of God, he reached out to people within the Creek Nation and also traveled to various churches as an evangelist. A devoted husband and father, he was also fluent in the Creek language and hymns.

Reverend Donnie McNac September 3,1956- January 28,2013

In 1999, Reverend Donnie McNac, along with Reverend Hill, approached our principal Chief with the concept for the event that we celebrate today. As a minister, Reverend McNac also spread the gospel to reservations in states such as Arizona. After his return to Oklahoma, he continued his ministry and served as the pastor of Tullmochussee Baptist Church. He was also active as a member of Bearers of the Cross, an Okmulgee-based outreach group.

Brother Jimmie Jones September 6, 1941- December 22, 2012

Brother Jimmie Jones was known as a caring supportive Christian man. A dutiful and devoted Christian, Brother Jimmie graciously volunteered his services to cook for the hundreds of the people who attended the first observance of the Muscogee Nation National Day of Prayer 7 Fasting.

Reverend Alfred Berryhill March 7, 1947- August 31, 2013

In 1999 Berryhill along with Reverend Hill & Reverend McNac, approached former chief Perry Beaver requesting a national day of prayer & Fasting. This blessed event continues through these mighty men of God who loved their Muscogee Creek people and was the first Muscogee Creek members to leave such a powerful legacy that as Muscogee creek people we will be in unity with the powerful prayers for the MCN. Alfred Berryhill was our former second chief of the MCN. He also served as a minister for many years at Tallahassee Indian Methodist church, Okmulgee, Oklahoma. He was also fluent in the Creek language & Hymns

The History of Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Day of Prayer

On April 3, 1999, Principal Chief Perry Beaver proclaimed the first Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Prayer & Fasting Day.

In April 2013 Principal Chief George Tiger Proclaimed Day of Prayer & Fasting.

August 2016 Principal Chief James R. Floyd Proclaimed the first Saturday of April as National Day of Prayer for the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.

April 2022 Principal Chief David Hill Proclaimed the first Saturday in April, Muscogee Creek Day of Prayer
